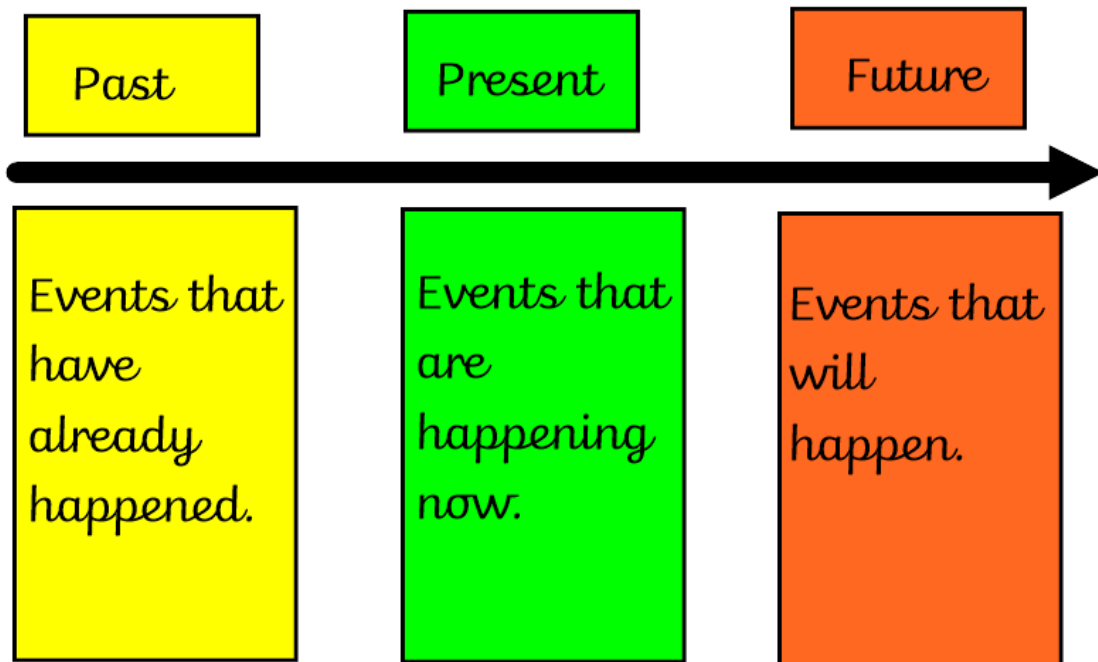
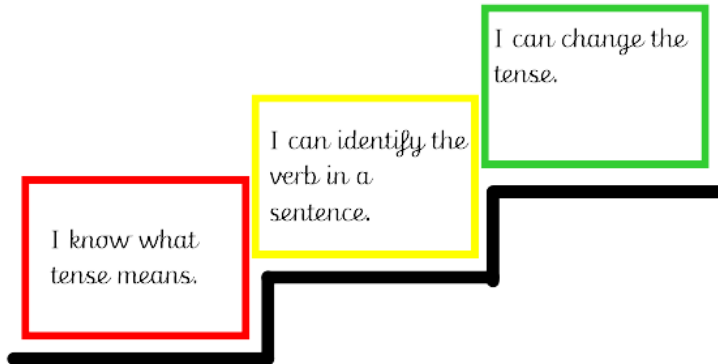

TBQ: Can I explore the use of present and past tense?



The verb in a sentence tells us the tense.



Claire **jumped** over the skipping rope.
past tense

Claire **jumps** over the skipping rope.

present tense
