Starter:

This week we are looking at the 'ar' and 'ur' sounds and alternative ways to spell them.

Our new focus Words:

people

eye

Revise old learning:

We are familiar with these two letters making the 'ar' sound. Practise reading these words.

market car

New learning:

In some words the 'ar' sound is made with the letter 'a'. We came across this in a focus word before half term. Depending on where you live, some other words with an 'a' may be pronounced as 'ar'.

father rather
