**Revisit old learning:**

So far we have learnt that the ar sound can be made with the digraph 'ar', the letter 'a' and the digraph 'al'. Test your knowledge by reading the words below.

Today we are going to be looking at the ur sound. We already know that the ur sound can be spelt with the 'ur' digraph like in these words.

surf turn

### New learning:

Today we are going to be looking at the ur sound using the 'or' digraph. In some words the digraph 'or' makes the ur sound.

Let's have a go at reading these words.

word world worse  
worm work worship
