P.E. Challenge

Challenge yourselves to practice the following ball skills everyday. You can do this against an outside wall or with a partner. 20×10^{-5} bounce pass, 20×10^{-5} chest pass and 20×10^{-5} should pass. At the end of the circuit why don't try and pivot-remember to glue one foot to the ground.

Our topic learning will cover these subjects this half term: Science, Geography, Design and Technology and Art and Design,

Optional Project Ideas

- Design a map of the local area of where you live. You could include shops, roads, parks churches, rivers, restaurants etc. Remember to include a compass to show the direction of North, East, South and West. Challenge your self to measure the difference between 2 points on your map.
- Use your sketching skills to create a new character that could star in your own book about a fantasy world in the mountains.

Please support your children with learning to read, understand and spell each word. These words are important in supporting your child with achieving age related expectations for their year group. Top Tips for Reading at Home

Read for at least 10 minutes every day, each time you read to an adult you will earn house points.



Read out loud and put expression into what is read.

Discuss what is happening. Can your children summarise what has happened, pick out the important events or read between the lines to tell you something that is implies about a character?

Discuss vocabulary and language. Does your child understand what a word means? Can they put it in their own sentence? Can they think of similar or opposite words.

Make reading together an enjoyable time. As well as reading books from school, your child might enjoy reading magazines, children's newspapers, journals, sports biographies or children's annuals.

<u>Maths</u>

Accelerated Maths! (KS2 only)

Accelerated Maths is an engaging online resource which targets the children at their level. They have a designated time slot in school once a week to access the tests and practise work that we are covering in lessons. We encourage the use of this outside of school as it will help your child progress in Maths

Times Table Rock Stars!

This is another fun online resource which will support your child with learning their times tables through games and competitions with their peers. They will have an opportunity to use it in school once a week but we recommend they access it at home for extra support.
