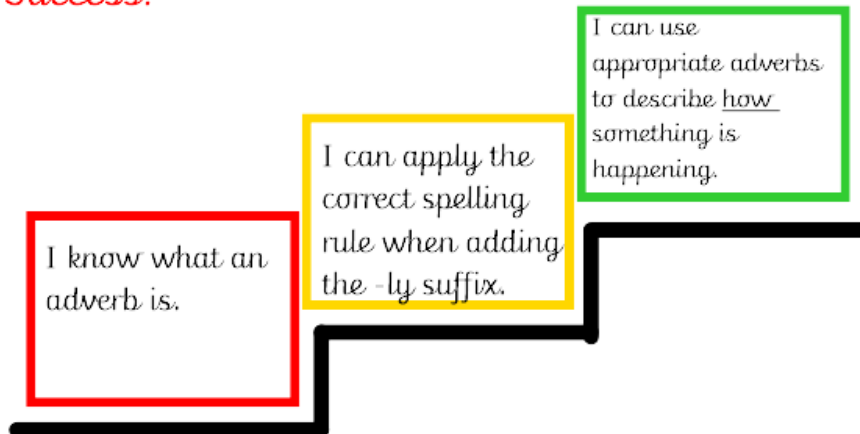

3. Carefully, Milo picked up the broken glass.

Adverbs often (not always) end using the suffix -ly. These are the adverbs that we are going to be looking at.

Most of the time we can just add the -ly suffix to the end of the word. For example

soft softly

quick quickly

sad sadly

However, if a word ends in a y, we must change the y to an i before adding -ly.

happy happily

funny funnily

crazy crazily

The boy ran **quickly** up the street.
