What does the P stand for?

The P stands for Predict.

To predict means:

Making predictions is a strategy in which readers use information from a text (including titles, headings, pictures, and diagrams) and their own personal experiences to anticipate what they are about to read (or what comes next)

## KS1 Reading Vipers

### Predict

Predict what you think will happen based on the information that you have been given.

#### Example questions

- Look at the book cover/blurb – what do you think this book will be about?
- What do you think will happen next? What makes you think this?
- How does the choice of character or setting affect what will happen next?
- What is happening? What do you think happened before? What do you think will happen after?

• What do you think the last paragraph suggests will happen next?



This book is historical fiction. This means it is a made up story but based on real life events that happened.

This story will tell us more about the Great Fire of London.
