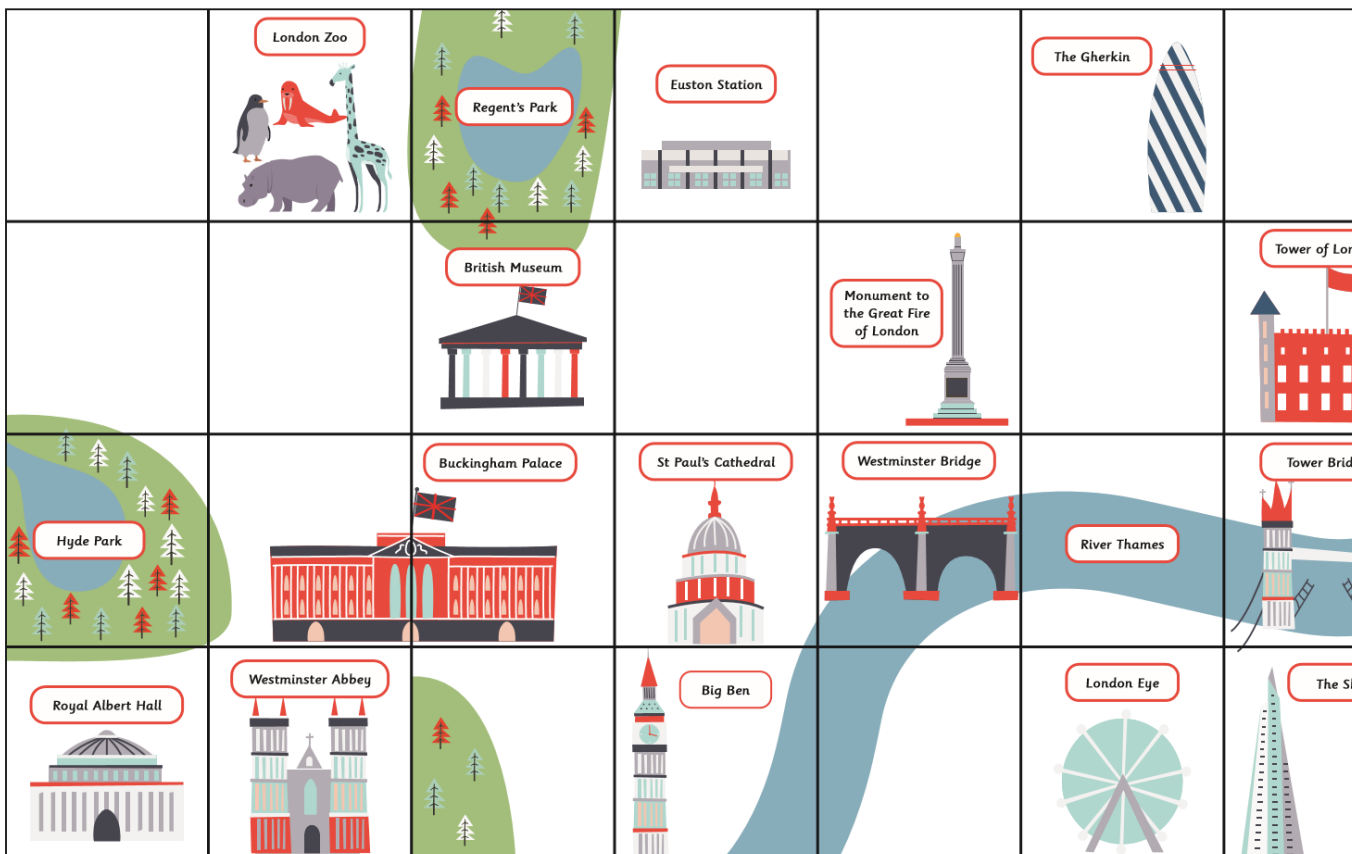


This is a grid map of London. It shows where the landmarks and geographical features are.
